

No Place In Mind Headband

This nifty little headband covers your ears and is functional as well as fashionable. Knit out of less than half a skein of bulky yarn, it is a quick and easy knit, perfect for warming your ears as you wander in the woods, or wherever you walk.

Yarn:

Approximately 45 yards/41 meters bulky weight yarn. Yardage will vary depending on head size. Sample knit from Critical Hit Dyes Barbarian Bulky (100% superfine superwash merino) in "Wild Magic: Junco."

Gauge:

5 sts to 1 inch on US 10s. Gauge is not crucial as long as you are measuring to your head.

Final Measurements (approximate):

Final measurements will vary based on the circumference of your head. Mine clocked in at 9" flat (18" circumference).

Needles:

US 10/6.0mm

Notions:

Tapestry needle (for weaving in ends)

Pattern Directions:

Using the long tail cast on method, CO 16 stitches.

For every row:

- S11, k1, ktbl, p, *k2, ktbl, p* to end.

Repeat pattern until the garment measures the diameter of your head, **slightly stretched**.

Bind off, leaving a sizable tail for weaving in ends.

Using mattress stitch, seam ends together. Block lightly, or wear as is.

Key

k - knit

sl1 - slip stitch knitwise with yarn in back

ktbl - knit through the back loops

p - purl

CO - cast on
